

# **Report Card 16 Country Highlights – Austria**

This report features child well-being outcomes against the backdrop of their country's policies and social, educational, economic and environmental context.

#### League table of child well-being outcomes

The league table of child well-being outcomes shows three dimensions: mental well-being, physical health and skills.

Austria ranks 16<sup>th</sup> in overall child well-being outcomes.

#### Good mental well-being

Feeling positive and being in good mental health are key aspects of quality of life. Austria ranks 21<sup>st</sup> in this dimension.

#### Good physical health

This includes rates of overweight and obesity, which affect children now and in future, and child mortality. Austria ranks 12<sup>th</sup> in this dimension.

#### Skills for life

Learning new skills can be a rewarding experience for children in the present, as well as a foundation for adulthood. Austria ranks 17<sup>th</sup> in this dimension.
